Your tour

Four countries in eight days? No problem! We start in Passau at the German border by boat. Alternating between water and land, you will travel along the Danube through Austria, Slovakia and Hungary. Impressive landscapes line your daily stages. And if you don't feel like pedalling, you can simply make yourself comfortable on your floating hotel.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Passau, Passau – Engelhartszell (boat)

Welcome to Passau! Your journey by bike and boat on the Danube begins at the landing stage of the Three Rivers City. Embarkation on the MS Prinzessin Katharina takes place between 4.00 and 5.00 pm. Use the time before departure to Engelhartszell for a short exploration tour through the pretty old town of Passau.

Day 2: Engelhartszell – Aschach, approx. 40 – 45 km, Aschach – Vienna-Nussdorf (by boat)

Your first stage on the bike is coming up! Before setting off, it is worth visiting Engelszell Abbey, the only Trappist monastery in Austria. Through the romantic river landscape of the Schlögener Schlinge - which you can view wonderfully from one of the vantage points – you cycle further along the Danube to Aschach. There you continue by boat to Vienna in the afternoon.

Day 3: Rest day in Vienna, Wien - Budapest (by boat)

Goodbye from Austria's capital! The ship remains in place until the evening. This gives you ample time to explore the city. Take a walk through the Old Town, visit St. Stephens Cathedral, Schönbrunn Palace, the Prater and the Hofburg Palace. Or how about a cosy visit to one of the many traditional coffee houses? With many impressions in your luggage, your journey by bike and boat on the Danube takes you overnight to Budapest

Day 4: Rest day in Budapest or cycle tour to Szentendre, approx. 50 km, Budapest – Visegrád (by boat)

Early risers take note! The morning hours offer a particularly beautiful view of the Danube and the approaching Budapest, which you will reach in the morning. Explore the Hungarian capital at your own pace. Or do you fancy a bike trip to the enchanting artists town of Szentendre? Enjoy your time in a charming street café and soak up the flair. From Budapest, take the boat at night to Visegrád.

Day 5: Round trip Visegrád – Vác – Visegrád, approx. 35 km, Visegrád – Bratislava (by boat)

Today you will get to know the Danube Bend. From Visegrád you cycle along the section of the Danube that almost forms a right-angled bend. The slightly hilly Danube Cycle Path takes you to Vác. Visit the sublime cathedral and the triumphal arch. It is the only one in Hungary and was built over 250 years ago. Back in Visegrád, visit the castle and the royal palace. In the afternoon we take the boat to Bratislava.

Day 6: Rest day in Bratislava, Bratislava - Wachau (by boat)

In the morning you arrive in Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia. Take a walk to the 4-towered castle, the citys landmark. It is enthroned on a rock above the Danube and offers its visitors beautiful views. Get to know the city more comfortably on a city tour in a vintage train (not included). Sample the hearty and rich Slovakian cuisine before returning to the ship. During the night, the ship sails into the Wachau Valley to Dürnstein or Rossatz.

Day 7: Wachau – Melk – Pöchlarn, approx. 40 – 50 km, Pöchlarn – Passau (by boat)

On the last stage of your journey by bike and boat on the Danube, you will pass through the special landscape of the Wachau. The region, characterised by wine terraces, castles and monasteries, is one of the most beautiful in Austria and will inspire you. Take a longer break in the small town of Melk. The Benedictine Abbey there is one of the most beautiful Baroque ensembles in Europe - absolutely worth seeing! In Pöchlarn you board the ship for the last time, which will take you back to Passau overnight.

Day 8: Individual departure from Passau

Once again you will enjoy the morning silence of this impressive river on your journey by bike and boat on the Danube, before you reach Passau at around 11:00 am. After disembarking, you will start your individual journey home.

Boat descriptions



MS Prinzessin Katharina

On board the premium ship MS Prinzessin Katharina you can expect classic elegance, a friendly crew and dignified furnishings. Just as you would expect from a princess. Enjoy the special ambience and let yourself be spoiled by the good cuisine. The Princess Katharina offers on two passenger decks, a panoramic restaurant, a cozy lounge, 2 bars and an inviting foyer. A book corner, a small store and a massage salon complete the good offer. On the spacious sundeck you will find enough deck chairs, shady places and windbreaks.

Facts about the ship:

- → 71 outside cabins: approx. 11 m² with beds at ground level
- → air conditioning, shower / WC, TV, hair dryer, small refrigerator
- → Main deck:
 - 38 2-bed cabins with 2 sofa beds arranged in L-shape
 - 1 single cabin; windows cannot be opened
- → On the main deck you can also book the cheaper cabins in the front and rear area of the MS Prinzessin Katharina. Here, however, engine and generator noises are perceptible when the ship is moving and in locks.
- → Upper deck:
 - 29 2-bed cabins with a sofa bed and a Pullmann bed (folded in during the day for more space) 2 single cabins and 1 triple cabin
- → all cabins have a French balcony with floor-to-ceiling windows that open
- → Year of construction: 1990
- → Renovation: 2015
- → 2 passenger decks | 70 outside cabins
- → Maximum occupancy: 140 passengers
- → Length: 110 m → Width: 11,2 m
