

Cycling Tour through the Luberon

Your tour

Provence is an absolute eye-catcher not only when the lavender blossoms. The cycle tour from Aix-en-Provence through the Luberon Nature Park is a bastion of scents and intense colours. The Luberon is a small mountain range in southern France. Largely forested, it is divided into the Petit Luberon to the west and the Grand Luberon to the east. Picture-book mountain villages, stately Roman monuments, cosy street cafés under shady plane trees, the castle of the Marquis de Sade, the papal city of Avignon – all this awaits you on the eight-day cycle tour through the Luberon. You should bring along a certain basic level of fitness so that you can fully enjoy the eight days on the saddle in these wonderful surroundings!

Parking in Aix-en-Provence

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Aix-en-Provence

Welcome to Provence and Aix-en-Provence, one of the cities with the highest quality of life for the French. Not only Paul Cézanne settled here. Pablo Picasso also lived here for a few years and was enraptured by the city and its surroundings between the Sainte-Victore mountains, the Touloubre and Arc rivers, the Durance valley and the Trévaresse vineyards. Have a coffee in the most famous café of the city, the Deux Garçons, where the novelists Émile Zola, Paul Cézanne and Jean Cocteau already frequented.

Day 2: Aix-en-Provence - Pertuis, approx. 55 km

Get on the saddle and enjoy the first stage of your bike tour through the Luberon. You'll ride to Silvacane Abbey, a beautifully restored Cistercian abbey dating back to 1145, and then on to Lourmarin, in the south of the mighty Luberon. Named one of the most beautiful villages in France, the small town with its Renaissance castle and typical Provençal flair has enchanted famous writers such as Peter Mayle and Albert Camus.

Day 3: Pertuis - Apt region, approx. 60 km

You leave the town of Pertuis and cycle on this rather challenging stage through the Luberon Biosphere Reserve, which has been designated by UNESCO. The rugged cliffs and wild, lush nature with its pine forests are very popular with cyclists and hikers, because you are away from the tourist crowds. In the pretty town of Céreste, you can catch your breath in a café before heading into Apt, the center of Provence. Taste your way through the rich offer of candied fruits.

Day 4: Apt - L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue region, approx. 55 km

Take another exploratory tour through the narrow streets of the old town, but then you should soon be on your way. Look forward to this stage on the bike tour through the Luberon, because it will be beautiful. The picturesque mountain villages of Bonnieux, Lacoste and Ménerbes outdo each other in terms of southern French charm. Above Lacoste you can visit the ruins of the castle of the same name, a former residence of the Marquis de Sade. But that's not all, because the overnight stop L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue is a small green paradise with many side arms of the river Sorgue, where old paddle wheels still turn. The town has transformed itself from a fishing village into a center for antiquarian treasures.

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Day 5: L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue – Saint-Rémy-de-Provence, approx. 35 / 55 km

On this stage of the bike tour through the heart of Provence, you have two options today. Either you opt for the shorter stage, which takes you via the melon town of Cavaillon to Saint-Rémy-de-Provence. Or you can take a detour of about 20 kilometers to experience the vibrant Avignon, the city of the popes. Whether a visit to the much-praised bridge over the Rhône, a tour of Notre-Dame-des-Domes Cathedral or the Palace of the Popes is on the agenda, Avignon is justifiably one of Provence's tourist magnets!

Day 6: Saint-Rémy-de-Provence – Salon-de-Provence, approx. 45 / 55 km

Saint-Rémy-de-Provence deserved more time to explore, as Vincent van Gogh spent his last years here. Famous paintings like the Starry Night were created in Saint-Rémy-de-Provence. Nostradamus was born here, the Romans have left their traces. Glanum is one of the most important archaeological sites in France. You will cycle through

the Alpilles on the bike tour through the Luberon to the magnificent fortified town of Les Baux. Even the Greeks were inspired by this special landscape to write a Heracles saga. Salon-de-Provence is the conclusion of this exciting day on the bike saddle.

Day 7: Salon-de-Provence - Aix-en-Provence, approx. 50 km

The last stage, back to the starting point Aix-en-Provence is coming up. But before that, take a stroll through the fortress Chateau de l'Emperi or the Collegiate Church, where Nostradamus, who worked as a clairvoyant, pharmacist and doctor, is buried. You will arrive back in Aix-en-Provence after an entertaining bike ride that takes you through pretty southern French villages. Stroll again along the Cours Mirabeau, the beautifully shaded boulevard, and enjoy the savoir vivre of Provence.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.

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
