Along the Neckar, Kocher and Jagst, you cycle to the Burgenstraßen cycle path, sometimes flat, but it often goes uphill and downhill. Over you, numerous proud fortresses and ancient castles supervise you, like the castle ruin Heidelberg, the Imperial Palace in Bad Wimpfen and the castle of Götz von Berlichingens in Jagsthausen. The night guard in Rothenburg ob der Tauber sets the right final chord – with its numerous anecdotes it makes past times alive.

Bike handover

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Heidelberg

Heidelberg is considered one of Germany's most beautiful towns. The harmonious flair of Neckar, historic quarter and castle in the midst of vineyards has fascinated artists and poets of the Romantic and will surely enchant you, too. Heidelberg Castle and its beautiful gardens are worth a visit.

Day 2: Heidelberg – Eberbach, approx. 40 km

Your way leads you through Neckar Valley to Eberbach, which is located at the foot of an extinct volcano. Above the town on a hill are Eberbach castle ruins. The size of the complex can only be guessed at by the imposing remaining walls. See the four still intact towers in the historic quarter, which served as the medieval town fortifications.

Day 3: Eberbach – Bad Friedrichshall / Neckarsulm, approx. 55 km

This route takes you along the Neckar to the historic old town of Bad Wimpfen. You will recognnize the town's skyline from afar. A short distance now separates you from today's destination, the salt town of Bad Friedrichshall. The Kocher and Jagst rivers meet here and join the Neckar and will bewitch you in this lovely unsoiled riverland.

Day 4: Bad Friedrichshall – Jagsthausen / Sindringen, approx. 40 / 50 km

After breakfast, you cycle along the Kocher-Jagst cycle path, first along the Jagst to Jagsthausen, home of the Knight, Götz von Berlichingen. He spend a few years of his childhood at Castle Jagsthausen, which was also named Götzenburg. Explore the town and visit the Red and White Castle or the old town hall in the town centre.

Day 5: Sindringen – Öhringen – Schwäbisch Hall, approx. 40 / 50 km

You leave the home of Knight Götz von Berlichingen and cycle along the German Limes cycle path to Öhringen. The town on the Limes will enchant you with its special atmosphere and history. The former Hohenlohe castle is on the medieval marketplace, the heart of the town. The Castle Route cycle path takes you to today's destination, Schwäbisch Hall.

Day 6: Schwäbisch Hall – Kirchberg, approx. 40 km

Your bike takes you through the Jagst Valley to Kirchberg. The river has cut a deep path into the shell limestone of the Hohenlohe Levels and formed an impressive valley. The striking town backdrop with its town tower, castle and church rises over the lovely Jagst valley. On a pleasant wander through the town you have the chance to see Kirchberg Castle.

Day 7: Kirchberg – Rothenburg ob der Tauber, approx. 35 km

In the morning you cycle to Rothenburg ob der Tauber. The historic old town features pretty timber-framed houses, narrow towers, winding streets and impressive fortifications. In the evening join the night watchman on a tour through winding streets and brightly lit squares.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
