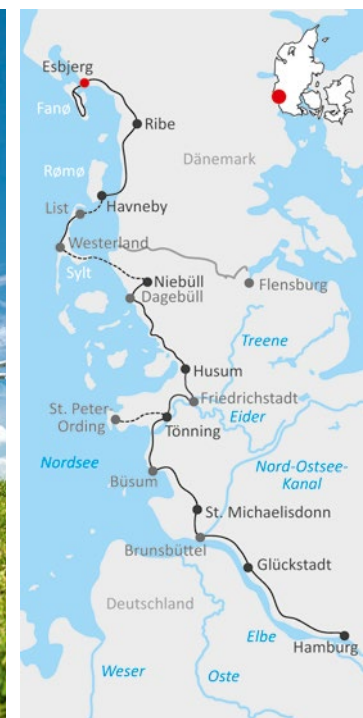

Your tour

Thatched houses, sheep grazing on dikes, red-and-white striped light-houses and the interplay of high and low tide - on the North Sea Cycle Route you will experience the full program of the North Sea coast! You start in the important Danish port city of Esbjerg and cycle not far from the coast to Ribe, the oldest city in Denmark. The tour continues to Husum, which is not at all gray, to the kilometer-long sandy beach of St. Peter-Ording, through Dithmarschen and along the Elbe to Hamburg. On the way you will get to know the islands of Fanø, Rømø and Sylt.

Journey to Esbjerg

- Nearest airports: Billund, Hamburg
- Train station: Esbjerg

Parking in Esbjerg

- Parking garage Europark, Jernbanegade 20, fee required
- Hotel parking (available in some hotels, chargeable, details in travel documents)

Bike handover

- Arrival: Guests' rental bikes will be available at the arrival hotel.
- Departure: The guests leave the bikes at the last hotel. If an e-bike has been rented, the battery, charger and key must be returned to the reception.

Luggage transport

- Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

Travel documents

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Esbjerg

Your cycle tour begins in Esbjerg, Denmark. The town was founded a good 150 years ago. From the top of Vandtårnet you have a wonderful panoramic view of the city, the harbour and as far as the island of Fanø. Or how about a trip to Sædding beach? It is overlooked by the striking sculpture group Man by the Sea.

Day 2: Esbjerg – Ribe, approx. 35 / 65 km + Trip to the island of Fanø

If you don't mind the extra kilometers, you should make a detour to the island of Fanø today, which you can reach comfortably by ferry (not included). Cycling around the island you will experience a mix of dunes, beach forests and mudflats (+ 35 km). Back on the mainland you will go to Ribe, the oldest town in Denmark. In the middle of the old town is the Riber Cathedral with its two unequal towers, which can be seen from afar.

Day 3: Ribe – Havneby (island Rømø), approx. 45 km

From Ribe you return to the North Sea. Via the road dam Rømødæmningen you reach the Wadden Sea island Rømø. The beaches of Rømø together form the largest sandy beach in Northern Europe. Impressive! Discover the Kommandørgården, the whalebone fence and the Rømø Kirke from the year 1200 during a tour of the island. You will spend the night in Havneby, the island's main town.

Day 4: Havneby – Sylt island – Niebüll / Schlüttsiel, approx. 20 / 35 km + Ferry- and Train ride

From Havneby you can take the ferry (included) to the island of Sylt. A network of bike paths over 200 kilometers long offers many opportunities to get to know the island on a shorter or longer tour. Organize your time on Sylt just as you like before you take the train (included) over the Hindenburgdamm to Niebüll. Due to its proximity to Denmark, Danish and Frisian culture meet in this small town. Learn more about the everyday and economic life of the North Frisians in the Frisian Museum.

Day 5: Niebüll – Husum, approx. 55 / 40 km

From Dagebüll you cycle directly along the coast. On the way, make a detour to the Hamburger Hallig (+ 8 km). The small peninsula is very easy to reach by bike. At the end of the Hallig, an inn invites you to a longer and more scenic stay. In your destination for the day, Husum, the town's most famous son, Theodor Storm, is commemorated at every turn. The writer once described Husum as a gray town by the sea. Far from it, because the colorful and lively harbor town is neither gray nor drab.

Day 6: Husum – Tönning / Lunden, approx. 35 / 40 km

Before you continue cycling, stay a little longer in Husum. Stroll through the old town with its narrow streets and harbor. Back in the saddle, you'll ride through nature. Situated between the rivers Eider and

Treene is Friedrichstadt, the so-called Dutch town with its canals. Take advantage of the shortness of your today's stage for an extensive walk, lunch and perhaps a canal ride. Then cycle to Tönning with its historic harbor and the Multimar Wattforum, the largest visitor center for the Wadden Sea National Park in Schleswig-Holstein.

Day 7: Excursion to St. Peter-Ording, approx. 55 / 65 km + train ride

In the morning you will take the train to Sankt Peter-Ording, the famous seaside resort with the huge beach and the pile dwellings. You should not miss the lighthouse Westerhever, the most famous lighthouse in Germany. Across the Eiderstedt peninsula you will reach the famous Eider barrage shortly before Tönning.

Day 8: Tönning – St. Michaelisdonn, approx. 60 / 70 km

From Tönning, the route returns to the North Sea. A first stop is worthwhile at the Eidersperrwerk, Germany's largest coastal protection structure. Your next stop is Büsum. The town has a green beach that stretches for miles, where you can enjoy a wonderful roll topped with Büsum crabs. From the sea you cycle into the Dithmarschen. You will pass Meldorf with its cathedral, which can be seen from afar and is typical for northern Germany in brick Gothic style. Here you can shorten your stage by 15 km by train (not included). With St. Michaelisdonn you reach your destination of the day. The landmark of the village is Edda, a Dutch windmill.

Day 9: St. Michaelisdonn – Glückstadt, approx. 55 km

Today's stage takes you through the Dithmarschen region to Brunsbüttel. There you will reach the Kiel Canal. In operation since 1895, it is one of the busiest artificial waterways in the world. At the canal locks, you will observe small and large ships as they impressively pass through the canal. Your destination for the day, Glückstadt, was built in the 17th century according to designs on the drawing board. A culinary specialty is the Glückstädter Matjes. Known beyond the borders of Schleswig-Holstein, it is traditionally produced according to old recipes.

Day 10: Glückstadt – Hamburg, approx. 55 km

Today you cycle along the Elbe towards your destination Hamburg. In Wedel, you will encounter the Willkomm-Höft ship welcoming facility. Large ships arriving at or departing from the Port of Hamburg are greeted or bidden farewell with the Hamburg flag hoisted or lowered - including the national anthem of the home country. Once in Hamburg, there is much to see and discover. Take a boat trip through the port of Hamburg, walk through the Speicherstadt and watch the traders haggling at the legendary fish market.

Day 11: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
