Red-white light houses and green dikes at the North Sea shore, honorable manor houses and high steep cliffs at the Baltic Sea shore. And in between? The elongated inlet of the Schlei, the Kiel Canal with its big ships, the Dutch city Friedrichstadt and wonderful cycle paths. Of course, also a visit in St. Peter-Ording is programmed. You need to have seen the sand yachts, that are rushing back and forth at the kilometer-long sand beach.

- Closest airports: Hamburg, Billund
- Train station: Husum

Parking in Husum

- Harbour car park: Am Binnenhafen, 470 parking spaces, unlimited, costs approx. 8 euros / day.
- Hotel parking spaces (available in individual hotels, chargeable, details in the travel documents).

Bike handover

- Arrival: Guests' rental bikes will be available at the arrival hotel.
Departure: The guests leave the bikes at the last hotel. If an e-bike has been rented, the battery, charger and key must be returned to the reception.

Luggage transport

- Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

Travel documents

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Husum

The small town of Husum is shaped by the interplay of the tides. The North Sea reaches right into the inland harbour. Observe the ebb and flow of the tide in the middle of the town. Stroll through the narrow streets and alleys and marvel at the picturesque, differently coloured gabled houses.

Day 2: Husum – Schleswig, approx. 45 km

After leaving the North Sea you start cycling along the Eider-Treene-Sorge path to Hollingstedt, where you can visit Northern Europe's largest archaeological monument that dates back to the Vikings: the Haithabu trading post and the Danewerk fortifications. Soon after that you will arrive in Schleswig, a lovely little town located directly on the banks of the Schlei. Here you should consider visiting Gottorf castle, the baroque garden, and the giant globe.

Day 3: Schleswig – Kappeln, approx. 50 km

Today the Schlei will accompany you on your trip. On your way from Schleswig to the North Sea you will pass many small and pretty villages, such as Arnis, the smallest town in Germany. Take a break here and enjoy the maritime flair of the town. A little further down the road you will arrive in Kappeln, where you can have a look at the largest Dutch windmill of state, the herring fence, and the museum harbour.

Day 4: Kappeln – Eckernförde, approx. 45 km

The Baltic Sea resort Damp is easily accessible via the peninsula Schwansen. There you can relax in a beach chair along the sandy 4 km beach. After your break you continue your journey through unspoilt nature, past old avenues, over gentle hills, and lush green forests to Eckernförde. Spend the evening at the beautiful and idyllic harbour promenade. Try the freshly caught fish in one of the cosy restaurants.

Day 5: Eckernförde – Rendsburg, approx. 40 km

Today's stage takes you through the hinterland, past Lake Witten, to Rendsburg. Here you will reach the Kiel Canal with its historic high bridge and floating ferry.

You feel like cycling more kilometers and your legs are still fit? Then alternatively cycle along the coast towards Kiel. Shortly before the capital of Schleswig-Holstein, the Kiel Canal flows into the sea. It is one of the busiest waterways in the world and you will largely follow it on your route to Rendsburg (+ 35 km).

Day 6: Rendsburg – Friedrichstadt / Lunden, approx. 50 / 60 km

Stroll through the old town of Rendsburg with its narrow streets, medieval squares and the old town hall. Back in the saddle, you will ride again through the charming nature and small villages with thatched roofs, where time seems to stand still. Situated between the rivers Eider and Treene is the absolutely worth seeing Dutch town Friedrichstadt with its canals.

Day 7: Friedrichstadt – St. Peter-Ording – Husum, approx. 55 / 45 km + train ride

On the way to Tönning with its historic harbor and national park visitor center, you pass the well-known Hoyerswort manor house. Behind Tönning you pass the impressive Eider barrage. Soon you will reach St. Peter-Ording with its 12 kilometer long flat sandy beach. From the dunes you have an unmistakable view over the houses on stilts, the whizzing beach sailors and the wide sea. You should definitely plan a side trip to Germany's best-known lighthouse, Westerhever. Then take the train to Husum, your last overnight stop.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
